

Governor Signs Bill to Establish Substance Abuse Prevention Center

Gov. John Hickenlooper signed Senate Bill 17-193 to fund the Center for Substance Abuse Prevention at the CU Skaggs School of Pharmacy. The law, sponsored by State Senators Cheri Jahn and Kevin Lundberg and State Representatives Brittany Pettersen and Bob Rankin, creates a Center for prevention, research and treatment to tackle opioid and prescription drug abuse problem with a \$1 million appropriation from the marijuana tax cash fund. Faculty member Rob Valuck, PhD, was instrumental in getting the law passed and the Center established.
