DOPS Highlights

In October, DOPS Chair David Ross, PhD, was part of a working group of 27 scientists from 13 countries who met to evaluate the carcinogenicity of benzene. The meeting took place at the International Agency for Research in Cancer, a part of the World Health Organization (WHO), in Lyon, France. A preliminary report

from the IARC working group will be published in Lancet Oncology in December, and a full report will be included in the IARC monograph series.
